

To all Vendors, Suppliers and Contractors serving Virginia International Terminals

Virginia International Terminals (VIT) and the Virginia Port Authority (VPA) are active participants with the Environmental Management System (EMS) (ISO-14001).

Suppliers, vendors, and contractors are required to train their employees accessing our facilities in Norfolk (NIT), Portsmouth (PMT) and Newport News (NNMT) in environmental awareness, emergency and spill procedures.

Vendors, suppliers, and contractors accessing VIT terminals are required to know that VIT has an environmental policy in effect. This policy is available for review on our website at <http://www.vit.org> on the homepage under “VIT Info”.

Additionally, those suppliers, vendors, and contractors, who deliver or service, parts and/or equipment of a hazardous or non-hazardous nature (i.e., batteries, petroleum products including bulk lubricants and fuel, solvents, etc.), must be trained in emergency and spill procedures and their training records available for inspection and/or review.
